Graduated with full votes in the University of Law in Turin, and then attained a Master in International Relationships in New York. From 2001 she works in United Nations Interregional Crime and Justice Research Institute (UNICRI) in Turin. From 2004 she coordinates the programs of UNICRI in Africa, Latin America, Asia and East Europe. From 2005, she is the Focal Point in UNICRI of Human Rights and the Focal Point of the United Nations Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Program Network of Institutes (PNI).

Paola Jacob



Paula Iacob was one of the promoters of the UNESCO Clubs movement in Romania, being part as a member of the first UNESCO Club from Romania, following in 1998 to become the President of the Romanian Federation for UNESCO Clubs, Centers and Associations. Her permanent work was crowned with the title of Vice President of EFUCA and for special merits in the UNESCO Clubs movement she was honored with the distinction "A Life dedicated to UNESCO".

Paula Iacob militated permanently for the people and animals rights, a special attention being given in her career to the gender issue, being also President of the Association of Women of Juridical Career.

Are culture, VIOLENCES e poverty inter-connected?

A research of the Agency of European Union for fundamental rights, presented in the Parliament in Brussels on the 8 March 2014, confirms that 33% of European women have been subject to violences. Only 1/3 of them have reported the aggression.

It's estimated that the phenomenon of the violences of gender hits at least 62 millions of European citizenship from 17 to 74 years old and cost about 223 billions Europe.
